April 10, 2022 Delivered Up (Easter Series) Crucified– Matthew 27:24-50

Crucifixion. The very word makes people uncomfortable. It was a brutal and painful way to die. And this is how Jesus Christ, the Messiah, died. The epistle of 1 Peter makes it clear that Jesus suffered while He was on the cross. In this passage from Matthew, we see four ways Jesus suffered. His suffering was complete and total. That is especially important because on the cross He bore the complete and total penalty for our sins.

5. How is the Holy Spirit leading you to respond to God today?
