October 17, 2021 Habakkuk – A Faith that Shines in the Darkness Growing in Our Faith Habakkuk 3:1-15

At the beginning of chapter 2, Habakkuk braced himself for God's second answer. God's first answer and His plan did not satisfy the prophet. Habakkuk perched himself on the wall waiting for God to explain His wretched plan. If necessary, Habakkuk was prepared to launch a third complaint at God. However, that is not how Habakkuk responds in chapter 3. Complaint gives way to compliance. Accusation turns to submission. Unbelief becomes worship. Habakkuk pens a beautiful psalm of worship and praise directed to God. In that psalm, we witness the prophet's faith growing and shining brightly into the darkness that surrounds him.
