November 14, 2021 Promises of the New Covenant, pt. 1 Jeremiah 31:31-40

We often use the phrase "New Covenant Christian." Because we live on this side of the cross, we take for granted this is the way it has always been. However, it has not. Jeremiah 31 predicts a monumental change in the way God will interact with His people. God tells them everything they have known and understood in their lifetime, is going to change. This new way of interaction would cause shock and fear among God's people. They would want to know, "Why change the covenant?" God in His steadfast love replaces the Old Covenant with a better covenant that contains better promises. We will examine four of the eight promises of the New Covenant.
